



So easy to grow, yet produce valuable coloured bare stems for floral use in winter. The colour of the stems make a worthwhile addition to the winter supply. When the leaves drop and the Cornus goes into winter dormancy, what remains are elegant coloured bare stems.

Plant 1 metre apart either way for two rows then leave two metres as a tractor gap, before planting two more rows 1 metre apart. Very cold hardy. These varieties can be successfully grown throughout NZ. Usually the colder the winter, the better the colour, but these Cornus produce good colour in warmer climates as well. Cornus perform well in most soil types.

### **Cornus sanguinea 'Midwinter Fire'**

Flaming orange yellow branches in winter. A very unusual colour.

### **Cornus alba Kesselringii**

Purple black branches in winter and branches with red leaves in spring. A shrub with lots of branches, with a long harvest period.
