



Rose hips

Rose hips are another crop that are in big demand and grow to perfection in New Zealand. The following rose hip varieties are bred especially for the floral trade. Some have small thorns, some have none at all. The hips are upwardly facing and form in groups on top of the stems.

- **Care.** The hips are easy to grow and prefer a position that has a drier autumn. A regular spray program to control aphids, botrytis, Black Spot etc will grow rose hips to perfection.
- **Spacing.** Plant 1 to 1.5 metres apart both ways. Some initial support may be required until they become established, usually after the first year.

Rosa Amazing Fantasy® (Kolamaz ^{PVR protection})

A very healthy, new thornless downy rose. The branches can be harvested with or without leaves. The hips are orange red turning to bright red.

Rosa Autumn's Pride (Kolaupri ^{PVR protection})

A very pretty rose hip, that has long branches that can be harvested with or without leaves. There are red rose hips from late summer to winter.

Rosa Giant Fantasy® (Kolgian ^{PVR protection})

A rose with very large hips, and few or no thorns. The large red hips can be harvested from late summer to winter. From Kolster BV - non propagation agreement

Rosa Magical Fantasy® (Kolmag ^{PVR protection})

An early variety with deep red hips. The harvest period is 3 weeks earlier than the other varieties.

A magnificent rose hip, that has virtually no thorns. The red branches hold the red rose hips, from late summer to winter.
